Distinguished delegates,**

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Allow me first to **welcome the long-awaited ceasefire in Gaza**, a moment that reminds us that peace is always possible when political will prevails.

However, we **need to ensure the full implementation of all stages of the Gaza ceasefire agreement**, and to **initiate practical steps** towards a just and comprehensive peace based on the **two-state solution**.

Jordan also **pays tribute to the International Committee of the Red Cross** for its tireless humanitarian efforts, and for its role in facilitating the **exchange of hostages and detainees**, providing humanitarian access, and protecting civilians during the most difficult moments.

The ICRC's work is a vivid reminder of the **indispensable role of neutral and principled humanitarian action** in times of war.

This has once again shown that **respect for international humanitarian law** is not only a legal obligation during conflict, but an essential foundation for peace itself.

And it is in this spirit that Jordan, alongside its partners, **launched the Global Initiative to Galvanize Political Commitment to IHL** to reaffirm that peace and protection are inseparable, and that humanitarian principles must remain at the heart of political decision-making.

Excellencies,

As one of the founding States of this Global Initiative, **Jordan welcomes the Progress Report** and commends the co-chairs and the ICRC for their dedicated efforts in compiling the outcomes of the first consultations.

This report captures a wealth of ideas and identifies **key cross-cutting elements** that emerged across the seven workstreams, reflecting a shared understanding of the urgent need to strengthen compliance with international humanitarian law.

The report reminds us that the main challenge we face today **is not the absence of rules, it is the absence of political will** to implement them.

Upholding IHL is not simply a legal exercise; **it is a political and moral responsibility.**

It requires leadership, resources, and courage to ensure that humanitarian principles guide our action, not only our words.

Excellencies,

Seventy-six years after the adoption of the Geneva Conventions, it is time to **elevate IHL as a political priority.**

States must invest in national implementation, education, and training; empower national IHL committees; and strengthen accountability mechanisms.

Political leaders must send a clear message that **violations of IHL are never acceptable**, and that **the protection of civilians and humanitarian access are non-negotiable obligations.**

The **Global IHL Initiative** offers a unique and inclusive platform to turn our shared conviction into collective action.

It brings together States, organizations, and partners united by one purpose: **to restore respect for the law that protects humanity in war.**

Jordan remains fully committed to working with all partners — to **galvanize political commitment**, to **prevent atrocities**, and to ensure that even in the darkest moments of conflict, **the limits imposed by humanity and by law are upheld.**
